NEW MEMBERSHIP

Please register with QMA online at www.quartermidgets.org, You are required to submit a copy of your child's birth certificate and pay the fee of \$200.00 USD.

You are also required to register with LQMA at <u>lqma.square.site</u> and pay for your 2025 LQMA Novice Membership. If you complete a Ride Clinic, your LQMA Registration will be waived.

KEY DEPOSIT

You are required to pay a \$50 key deposit upon your initial registration. You will be provided with a key to the track allowing you to practice when it's convenient for you, except for when the track is closed. The key deposit is refundable when the track keys are returned to the Treasurer. You will receive this key once you have completed Novice Training.

Novice Training

Novice Training consists of a minimum of six training sessions and one Novice race. Training begins on Saturday, February 22, 2025. Please bring your race car, safety gear (race suit, donut or neck safety device, gloves, helmet, wrist restraints, proper shoes) and raceiver for the first day and if you don't have a car, you should arrange to have one for day two.

Facility Maintenance days are listed on the 2025 LQMA Race Schedule and additional work parties will be emailed to members. If you are not able to attend a Facility Maintenance day, you can offer to volunteer at alternate times that fit your schedule. 20 volunteer hours are required per family.
